in the short term, there is an ever growing list of items that needs to be addressed and any help or assistance that you may be willing to provide is definitely appreciated.

- Assist with or coordinate installation of new paper towel, hand soap, and toilet paper dispensers (much of this is already finished, we need to wrap it up!)
- Assist with administering the electronic bulletin board system
- Coordinate for quotes to replace exterior area lighting and supervise work
- Coordinate with Waste Management to modify service contract
- Complete installation of camera system (3 exterior cameras, 3 interior cameras still need to be placed)
- Coordinate purchase of new furniture for church office
- Leak Check toilets and/or replace parts where necessary
- Obtain quotes for changes to kitchen AC system or for AC upgrade in kitchen
- Continue installation of door access/entry systems
- Two old TVs and other items need to be taken to electronics recycling
- Research options to replace basement water fountain with water bottle fill station
- Research options for beverage vending machine installation
- Clean dryer vent

Regardless of your ability to assist with any of these projects, I am also seeking a small "steering group" that will participate in decision making and expense approvals. For the past two years a very small group has been making decisions for the church (sometimes unilaterally) with regards to the building. It would be nice to have some group discussion about what our priorities and needs are. Most of this work can be conducted via email or virtual meeting.

Please let me know if you're willing to assist in any of these capacities.

Health care professionals are hoping to de-stigmatize the conversation around naloxone. Even people who don't use drugs or opioids should have naloxone on hand. You never know when you'll encounter someone in need of this life-saving medication. Keep it in your purse or your car for when you might need it. Parents with teenagers are encouraged to keep naloxone in their homes. Parents can also give it to their teens to take to school or sporting events – and make sure to educate them on what to do. Having more of this life-saving drug in the community is important. You could end up saving a friend or neighbor in need.
