Finance

When folks ask how we are doing financially, the answer has been the same now for the last two years. We are ok, but only because our committees are very respectful of our funds and manage within their budgets. As the person trying to balance the checkbook, I sure do appreciate everyone continuing down this path. Financially, we aren't going broke, but we aren't permanently sustainable either. With the generosity of our members and friends, we have funds sufficient to enable our next pastor to grow the ministry, and we can meet our commitments. For a church in transition, this feels pretty good.

The NLC is a big part of our stability - If you ever wondered how important the NLC is to our continued ministry, know that they are crucial. Their monthly contributions to the church cover the entire mortgage and more than 2/3 of the utilities. Charitable giving basically covers the cost of staff, committees, and mission.

We have no secrets - If you ever want more information on the financial state of our church, I'm glad to help. I am not always super fast, but I will get a reply to you eventually with whatever it is that you need. The books are open for inspection, and while we don't share donor specific information, pretty much everything else is available for your perusal.


